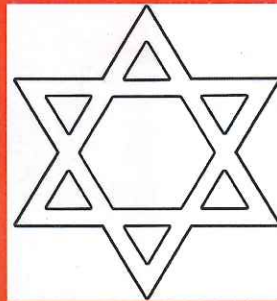

Born in Chelsea, NY to Irish and Dutch parents, she moved to New Jersey to raise her own family after she married.

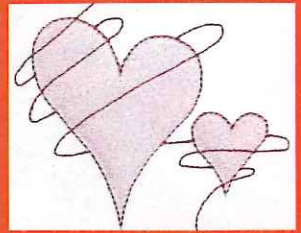
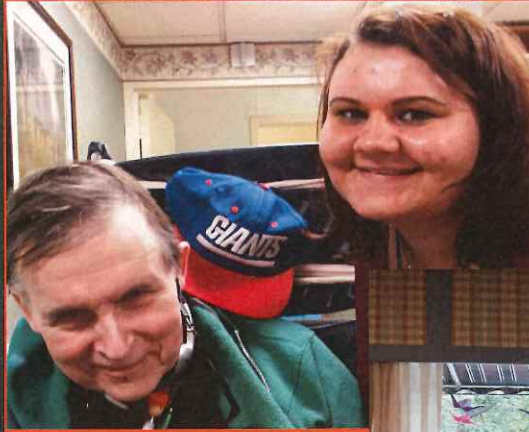
She was active in her church, in her children's school & activities when they were young and steadfastly instilled in them an appreciation of family. She believed in 'leading by example' and did so admirably.

Tanaisha Holloway, Receptionist

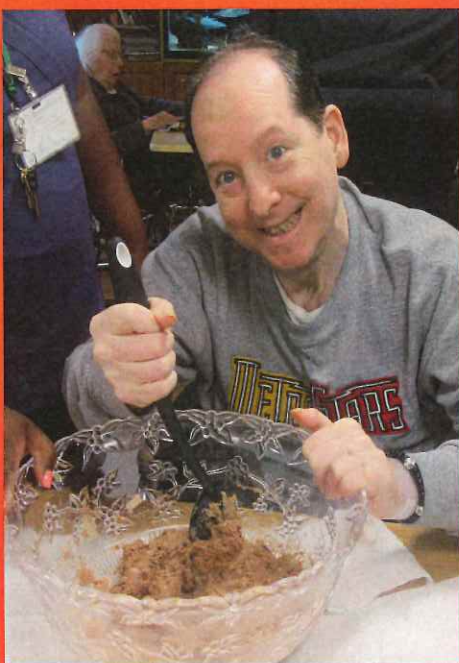
