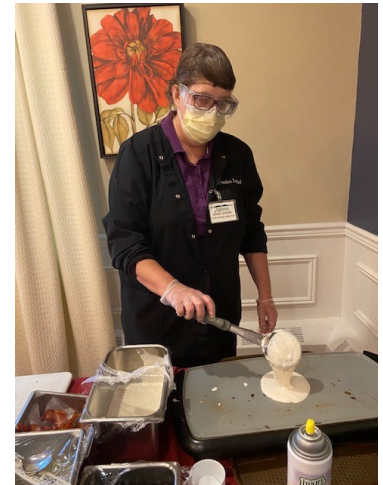


What's New in Recreation?

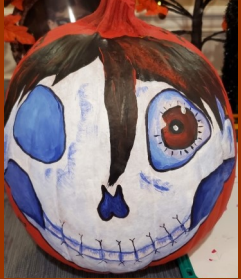


New Hire: Malyeah

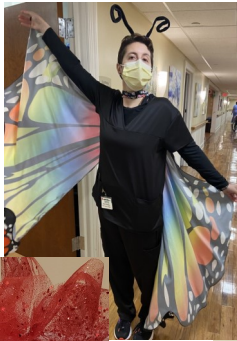
